# † From the Pastor †

In Rudyard Kipling's autobiographical book, *Something of Myself*, he tells how, after his marriage in 1892, he settled in a house that overlooked a wide valley in one of the loneliest stretches of New England.

One spring day, he and his wife made a journey to the far side of the valley. They were greeted by a hatchet-faced woman who lived on an isolated farmstead.

"Be ye the new lights crost the valley yonder?" she asked them fiercely. "Ye don't know what a comfort they've been to me this winter. Ye aren't goin' to shroud em up--or are ye?"

As long as they lived there, Kipling said, the lights of their homestead were never "shrouded up." The memory of the meeting with their lonely neighbor was with them every time they lighted their lamps.

As we walk through each day, we don't usually think of our self as a person of great influence and power over others. That is left to sports figures and movie stars and politicians. But, we cannot forget that eyes are always watching and ears are listening.

A child learns that even though they are told that everyone is loved by God, some are not so worthy of respect, because they hear us make fun of some group of people or describe privately a

certain ethnic group in a way we would not say out loud in public.

And we don't have to strike someone a blow – we can break their heart with an angry word.

The simple gift of giving our full attention to someone for whom we don't really have time speaks volumes about how valuable they are as an individual.

In the first reading today, the prophet Isaiah describes the manner in which Jesus will call all to himself – “. . .

*not crying out, not shouting, not making his voice heard in the street.*” Jesus invites himself into our life through the gentle call of love.

And it is so with us. On the day of our Baptism, we became dedicated to being a faithful witness to Jesus.

And our most powerful manner of witnessing is not through what we tell others to do, or say about our self. It is seen in the quiet witness of a life lived in harmony with Jesus – speaking words worthy of a child of God, acting in a manner that honors Jesus influencing our conduct, even thinking of others with the same spirit of reverence for the person we see as did Jesus.

Someone is always watching, always listening, always judging if we are what we claim to be – a person guided by Jesus himself.

# St. Monica School News

*Dear Parishioners,*

Happy New Year! St. Monica Catholic School Administration and School Board enter 2011 with confidence that the coming school year will be as successful as past years.

St. Monica eighth grade students will be taking the Independent School Entrance Exam (ISEE), an test required for admission into most local Catholic and private high schools, in January. Please remember them in your prayers. Open House for new students will be held on Jan. 21 at 9 a.m. in the Family Center. Parents will have the opportunity to speak to administrators, tour the campus, and visit classrooms. Please plan on attending if you have pre-school or elementary aged children and are interested in learning more about St. Monica School.

The School Board has completed the annual budget process. I am pleased to announce that kindergarten students will now be included in the family rate for St. Monica parishioners who have additional children attending St. Monica School. As in past years, we expect that our tuition rates will

continue to be at or below the levels of the similarly situated schools within the Diocese, and will be far below the rates of surrounding private schools. The tuition rate for one child at the subsidized parish rate has been set at \$5970. Tuition assistance continues to be a real need for a number of our parish families. As you plan your charitable giving for the year 2011, please consider helping a parish family provide a Catholic education for their children. 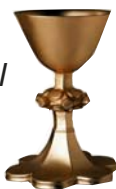

**E**n el libro autobiográfico de Rudyard Kipling, *Algo de Mí Mismo*, nos cuenta cómo, después de su matrimonio en 1892, se estableció en una casa que tenía vista a un valle ancho en uno de los extensiones más solitarios de Nueva Inglaterra.

Un día de primavera, él y su esposa hicieron un viaje al otro lado del valle. Fueron recibidos por una mujer con rostro de hacha que vivía en una granja aislada.

"Sois vos las nuevas luces a el otro lado del valle?" les preguntó con fiereza. "Vosotros no sabéis la comodidad que ha sido para mí este invierno. No iréis a cubrir- o si?"

Mientras que vivieron allí, dijo Kipling, las luces de su vivienda nunca fueron cubiertos. La memoria de la reunión con su vecina solitaria estaba con ellos cada vez que encendían las lámparas.

Mientras caminamos día, tras día no solemos pensar en nosotros mismos como una persona de gran influencia y poder sobre los demás. Eso se deja a figuras del deporte y estrellas de cine y políticos. Pero, no podemos olvidar que los ojos están siempre observando y oídos están escuchando.

Un niño aprende que, aunque se les dice que todo el mundo es amado por Dios, algunos no son tan dignos de respeto, porque nos escuchan burlarnos de algún grupo de personas o describir en privado un grupo étnico de una manera que no diríamos a voz alta en público.

Y no tenemos que pegarle a alguien con un golpe - podemos romper su corazón con una palabra de enojo.

El simple regalo de dar toda nuestra atención a alguien por quien realmente no tenemos tiempo dice mucho de lo valioso que es como un individuo.

En la primera lectura de hoy, el profeta Isaías describe la manera en que Jesús va a llamar a todos a sí mismo - "... No clamará ni alzará Su voz, ni hará oír Su voz en la calle." Jesús se invita a nuestra vida a través de la llamada dulce del amor.

Y así es con nosotros. En el día de nuestro Bautismo, nos comprometimos ser un testigo fiel de Jesús. Y nuestra manera más poderosa de presenciar no es a través de lo que le decimos a los demás a hacer o lo que decimos acerca de nosotros mismos. Se ve en el testimonio silencioso de

una vida vivida en armonía con Jesús - hablando palabras dignas de un hijo de Dios, actuando de una manera que honra la influencia de Jesús en nuestra conducta, incluso pensando de los demás con el mismo espíritu de veneración por la persona que vemos como lo hizo Jesús.

Siempre hay alguien mirando, siempre escuchando, siempre juzgando si somos lo que reclamamos ser - una persona guiada por el mismo Jesús.
