† From the Pastor †

Maya Angelou, wrote a best seller entitled *Wouldn't Take Nothing for My Journey Now*. In an essay entitled "Complaining," she remembers a lesson her grandmother taught her when Maya was a little girl in Stamps, Arkansas. From time to time, people would come into her grandmother's store muttering about the burdens of living. "How you doing?" grandmother would say. And the answer was predictable. "Not so good, Sister Henderson. It's this summer heat. I just hate it. It just frazzles me up and frazzles me down. It's almost killing me." Or from another weary soul, "I hate plowing. That packed down dirt ain't got no reasoning, and mules ain't got no sense...Sure ain't...My feet and my hands stay sore, and I get dirt in my eyes and up my nose. I just can't stand it.

"As soon as the complainer was out of the store, my grandmother would call me to stand in front of her. And then she would say the same thing she had said at least a thousand times, it seemed to me. 'Sister, did you hear what Bother So-and So or Sister Much to Do complained about? You heard that?' And I would nod. Mamma would continue, 'Sister, there are people who went to sleep all over the world last night, poor and rich and white and black, but they will never wake again. Sister, those who expected to rise did not, their beds became their cooling boards and their blankets became their winding sheets. And those dead folk would give anything, anything at all for just five minutes of this weather or ten minutes of that plowing that person was grumbling about. So you watch yourself about complaining, Sister. What you're supposed to do

when you don't like a thing is change it. If you can't change it, change the way you think about it. Don't complain....Whining is not only graceless, but it can be dangerous. It can alert a brute that a victim is in the neighborhood."

The first reading today records the reaction of the people of Israel, who had witnessed great miracles by God and been freed from generations of slavery in Egypt, but only a short time after their liberation they grew weary of their struggles in the desert and complained about God not meeting their expectations. They quickly lost sight about how truly blessed they were.

It is part of our human nature to be that way. Some people would give anything to be able to get up out of a wheelchair or a sickbed, but we complain because our parking place is too far away from the store. Some are all alone in the world, with no one to speak to them or care about them. And we complain because our children's schedule takes too much of our time, or because our parents want to be involved in everything we do. Some leave this world unexpectedly, without preparation. And we make our plans to pray more, and give up sins, and be more generous – at a future time.

During this Third Week of Lent, our call is to renew a spirit of gratitude. We are greatly blessed by God – so watch yourself about complaining. Our complaining demonstrates that we are blind to all that God is doing for us.

Maya Angelou, escribió un libro Best-Seller intitulado *No Tomaría Nada por Mi Viaje Ahora*. En un ensayo titulado "Quejando", recuerda una lección que su abuela le enseñaba cuando Maya era una niña en Stamps, Arkansas. De vez en

cuando, la gente venía murmurando en la tienda de su abuela sobre las cargas de la vida. "¿Cómo estás?" su abuela diría. Y la respuesta era predecible. "No muy bien, hermana Henderson. Es este calor de verano. Sólo lo odio. Simplemente me molesta. Casi que me mata." O de otra alma cansada, "Odio arar la tierra. Esa tierra no tiene ningún razón, y las mulas no tienen ningún sentido ... claro que no ... Mis pies y mis manos se quedan adoloridos, y se me mete sucio en mis ojos y mi nariz. No puedo soportarlo."

"Tan pronto que el quejoso se fuera de la tienda, mi abuela me llamaba para pararme delante de ella. Y entonces ella decía lo mismo que había dicho por lo menos un millón de veces, me parecía. 'Hermana, has escuchado de lo que el hermano fulano y la hermana mucho-que-hacer se han cejado? Has oído eso?' Y yo señalaba con la cabeza que si. Mamma continuaba, 'Hermana, hay gente que se fueron a dormir en todo el mundo de la anoche, pobres y ricos y blancos y negros, pero ellos nunca despertaran otra vez. Hermana, los que esperaban levantarse no pudieron, la cama se les convirtió en una tabla de refrescar y las mantas se convirtieron en sus sudarios. Y esa gente muerta daría lo que sea, cualquier cosa para tener sólo cinco minutos de este tiempo o diez minutos de la aradura de que ese hombre refunfuñaba. Así que ten cuidado acerca de quejadera, hermana. Lo qué se debe hacer cuando no te gusta una cosa es cambiarlo. Si no

se puede cambiar, cambia tu modo de pensar en ella. No te quejes quejarse no sólo es falta de gracia, pero puede ser peligroso. Puede alertar a una bestia que una víctima se encuentra en el barrio."

Las primeras lecturas de hoy hablan sobre la reacción del pueblo de Israel, que había sido testigo de grandes milagros de Dios y ha sido liberado de las generaciones de la esclavitud en Egipto, pero poco tiempo después de su liberación se cansaron de sus luchas en el desierto y se quejaban que Dios no cumplía con sus expectativas. Rápidamente perdió vista de cómo verdaderamente bendecidos estaban.

Es parte de nuestra naturaleza humana ser de esa manera. Algunas personas darían cualquier cosa por ser capaz de levantarse de una silla de ruedas o una cama de enfermo, pero nos quejamos porque nuestro estacionamiento está demasiado lejos de la tienda. Algunos están solos en el mundo, sin nadie que les

hable o que se preocupe por ellos. Y nos quejamos porque el calendario de nuestros hijos toma demasiado de nuestro tiempo, o porque nuestros padres quieren participar en todo lo que hacemos. Algunos dejaran este mundo inesperadamente, sin preparación. Y hacemos nuestros planes para rezar más, y renunciar a los pecados, y ser más generosos - en el futuro.

Durante esta Tercera Semana de Cuaresma, nuestro llamado es renovar un espíritu de gratitud. Somos muy bendecidos por Dios - así que ten cuidado en quejarme. Nuestros reclamantes demuestran que estamos ciegos a todo lo que Dios está haciendo por nosotros.
